Another EPIC Nabby summer drew to a close this week with the final two day Sr Camp EPIC event - COLOR WAR!

The entire Sr Camp showed their red and white colors this week as they competed for the coveted Color War trophy. The older four groups - Penn, Jackson, Tulane and Douglass competed against each other as did the younger four groups - Duke, Radcliffe, Columbia and Barnard.

All events were coed and the campers showed their skills in gaga, archery, tennis, basketball, dodgeball, miniature golf and football among others. The most exciting event, however, was the final event of the Color War - the coed water polo game. Teamwork for this competition was crucial as three passes were required by each team before a goal could be scored. As the entire Senior Camp lined the big pool cheering for their teammates, the game began and the Red team went ahead with a big 9-2 lead. The White team showed their never give up spirit, however, and tied the game at 9 all! The excitement was building as the Red team scored for a 10-9 lead, only to once again have the White team tie up the score to end regulation time.
