When the Bertino family bought Camp Nabby in 1970, only three buildings that are currently part of the Nabby campus were in existence - the boys bunks, the Nabby stage and the "casino" with the Art Shack below it.

The "casino" is actually our lunch and dining area, but it was much more than that on weekends years ago. It was a part of a bungalow community and was utilized as a place for plays (it originally had a stage), dances and various parties for the summer residents of the bungalows. Although the stage is gone, the stage door remains!

The original kitchen counter with its bar stools and decorative tile still stands as does something our campers know absolutely nothing about... a telephone booth with a rotary dial phone!

In March of 2018, the town of Yorktown presented Joe and Rita with the plaque affixed outside the "casino" door designating it an Historical Landmark.

NABBY NATURE

Campers arriving at Ranger Rick's nature area are always in for an amazing adventure! For 23 years Rick Lee has been instilling a love of nature in our campers. Assisted for the second year at camp and also during the school year by nature enthusiast Doug McCarthy, Ranger Rick creates a weekly theme for our campers to enjoy. The kids will study mammals, reptiles and insects and will learn about their behavior, diet and characteristics. After studying these animals the campers will experience them up close and personal as the Nature Hut is home to chickens, bunnies, turtles, snakes, lizards and a variety of insects. Two of the "stars" of Ranger Ricks nature program are Bo Jangles, a huge but very docile snapping turtle and Willow, a 2 year old giant Chinchilla rabbit! Rick received Bo Jangles at birth, when he was the size of a quarter, and, as you can see below, he's grown quite a bit since then! He's tame and doesn't "snap" as he was raised by Rick. However, should he released into a natural habitat, his fear factor would kick in and he might regain his snapping turtle image!

As much as the campers love interacting with the animals, another special activity is exploring our nature trail. A project started by Rick and his two sons back in 2002, the trail has been expanded each year and now includes a rest area, bridges, a mud bath and lots of walking paths.

Another nature activity that is looked forward to each summer is the campfire marshmallow roast. Campers love to gather around the fire and who doesn't love those gooey S'mores???

Rick devotes the summer months to Nabby but in the off-season Rick Lee's Nature Awareness School is in full throttle as well as his Wilderness Survival and Primitive Tools and Craft classes. Rick and his summer assistant Doug, visit many schools and organizations throughout the year with the audience ranging from tiny tots to high school seniors. And, of course, Rick is available for birthday parties as well. Look for him at various fairs and farmer's markets around Westchester... You might even get to meet and greet Bo Jangles!
